P603/24 Correspondence received after 10th October 2024

Cllr MacTiernan enquired whether Cllr Godwin was going to provide a brief report following a meeting that they had attended relating to the Garden Communities. Cllr Godwin said that some traffic modelling had been undertaken and it looked like a road would be installed from the new development onto Hardwick Bank Road. Cllr MacTiernan added that it had finally been agreed that, to bring a haul road out to Hardwick Bank Road close to the farm entrance and the motorway bridge, would make it impossible for large lorries to have enough room to turn. Instead, Tewkesbury Borough Council were looking at selling the raised land (which Northway Parish Council currently grass cuts) between the farm entrance and Hardwick Bank Road to allow for a junction to be installed at the location. Tewkesbury Borough Council would have to follow legal procedures and under Section 123(1) of the Local Government Act 1972 publicly advertise that they would be selling some land.
